Can you tell us a bit about your business?

Gamers Lounge is a retro gaming enterprise, aiming to provide a safe, inclusive space for all generations to enjoy the retro 80's to Y2K gaming aesthetic. Over the years I have collected and preserved a range of original gaming consoles from as far back as the 1980's. I host a network of events at arts centres in Surrey where people can buy a ticket to play a wide range of retro games.

What started as an interest has now developed into a business and Gamers Lounge has been booked for festivals and private parties over the past couple of years.

There is a strong social mission with Gamers Lounge – we want to bring people together through the medium of gaming. A good example of this is a online group we set up during the pandemic. The group still meets each week for an hour to chat about anything to do with gaming and people have established ongoing friendships through the group.

What made you come to ASM in the first place?

I can't remember to be honest as ASM have supported me for around 10 years

What kind of support did you get from ASM that helped you the most

ASM help me host monthly business meetings where we focus on the future direction of Gamers Lounge. It helps to have a mentor to discuss my ideas with and give me guidance around running a business
