

A Spotlight on.... Jo

What job do you have now, and how's it going?

I'm now working as a mentor for neurodivergent students in HE! It feels great, and I'm eternally grateful for the help I've received!

Why did you first reach out to AS Mentoring

I was looking for support to help me get back into work. Being newly diagnosed at the time and having reached burnout in my last role, I needed someone to help me work through the various questions and uncertainties that I had about returning to work as an autistic person; I needed someone to help me build my confidence again, understand why I found certain aspects of work challenging and a strain and help me identify work that would be sustainable and in line with my strengths.

I was hopeful that AS Mentoring had the knowledge and experience I so desperately needed.

What support have you received that has been most useful?

My mentor met me exactly where I was at. She helped me understand, in relation to autism, why I had struggled with certain aspects of my last role, and really helped me to see strengths in myself that I often overlooked. Not only that, but she was relentless in her encouragement that I had something to offer the workplace!

How did Autism Forward's support make a difference?

If it wasn't for Autism Forward's funding, I wouldn't have been able to access AS Mentoring.

Was there a moment you felt things started to turn around for you?

I grew in confidence gradually over the weeks. Things suddenly changed when my mentor suggested pursuing the very role that I'd been considering privately for a few years.
